## Pool Party Rules

## Signing your name on the calendar indicates that you have read and understand all rules below.

--To reserve the pavilion for a private event, use the posted calendar. Indicate your name, phone number, and times of your party. Include your clean up and prep time when signing up. You must be finished cleaning at the indicated time so that other parties coming in afterwards can start on time. If the party requires the use of the long tables, please indicate how many tables needed on the calendar.
--The pool is for the use of homeowners and their invited guests. Do not exceed a four hour party. Parties are intended for people who live here only, (not families and friends of friends, etc.) Parties are to not exceed 50 people in order for other residents to continue to enjoy the area.
--When having a private party at the pool, you may reserve the pavilion area only. All other areas of the pool must remain clear of party items. Events are in no way to impede other homeowners and their guests from access to the pool or pool deck.
-- No glass of any kind is allowed, including the use of flower vases, candles, picture frames, and beverage or food containers. You will be asked to set up a table outside the pool area for all items that include glass if you have guests who bring casseroles, etc. in glass pans. It is up to you to inform guests of this rule.
-- No open flames under the pavilion are allowed, including the use of candles.
-- No music may be used without headphones.
-- All parties are governed by the pool quiet hours.
-- All food garbage must be bagged and removed from the property. Food is not to be emptied into the trash cans without bags. If this occurs you will be assessed a cleaning fee for someone else to clean up your mess.
-- Clean up after the party is the responsibility of the host homeowner. The bar area, table tops, chairs, floors, and pool area including bushes, playground, and parking lot should be clean and free of food or other trash. If necessary, bring a broom or other cleaning supplies to your party. Be sure to include your clean up time in your pool party time so that other parties who come after you do not have to wait for you to clean up.
-- The Host/Homeowner is responsible for the actions of their invited guests. All homeowners and guests are expected to treat the facilities and other pool users with the utmost courtesy.
--In the event the pool and surrounding area is not cleaned up after a party, the additional expense incurred by the HOA from the cleaning service will be passed along to the sponsoring homeowner.
-- To reserve the Association's three 8-foot tables for your own use outside of pool parties, please indicate on the calendar date your name, the number of tables you will be using, and the hours of use. Please return tables to the men's restroom.
